 - Another incident involved two students crossing without crossing guard assistance, entering the street between two parked cars into on-coming traffic.
 - The third concerning situation involved an individual, parking in the staff parking lot across designated spaces to collect their child blocking others from exiting their space.
- These events are of SIGNIFICANT concern and pose a safety risk to every member of the Franklin School community. I am confident that working together we can correct our practice and engage in safe behaviors.
