

# FRANKLIN ELEMENTARY PTO GENERAL MEETING

Friday, January 22, 2021, 9:30am, Via Zoom

#### **MEETING MINUTES**

**Attendees:** Franklin PTO Executive Board members, Principal Janice Tierney, Franklin parents

## 1. PTO President's Update (Rachel Frank)

- Overview of PTO-funded programs since last October
  - Successful virtual book fair earned a \$1,700 credit to be put to use immediately toward books and educational materials selected by Ms. Stochaj
  - Interactive music technology assembly was presented in November
  - Second assembly being planned for late winter/spring
  - Scott Magoon virtual author/illustrator visit scheduled for March 19
- o This is a snapshot of how PTO funds directly benefit our children

## 2. Virtual Franklin Fair 2021 (Chairs: Elizabeth Somerlot & Leah Enthoven)

- Virtual event planned for Saturday, April 24
- This year's theme is "Future is So Bright"
- Largest PTO fundraiser directly supports assemblies, author visits, field day, capital improvements, FLIC, teacher mini grants, etc.
- Volunteers are needed for big and small tasks
- Event will include silent auction, 50/50, and children's raffle
- Children's raffle
  - This year there will be options for families to create own basket, to choose a themed basket to build, or to donate money to fund a basket
  - Children will have the opportunity to watch the raffle winners announced live, virtually
  - Children's raffle basket Signup Genius will be sent out shortly to Franklin community:

  - Parent suggested that a communication be created for class parents to distribute to their individual classrooms



## 3. State of the School (Janice Tierney)

- Looks forward to in-person meetings again, but also hopes to merge the virtual component for parents to dial-in from home/workplace
- Thanks parent community for service, generosity, and kindness
- Presentation of Franklin response/results of December District parent survey
  - 229 Franklin families, 39% responded to district survey
  - 98% responded that instructional model is positive, 94% responded that model is more effective or somewhat more effective than last spring
  - 86% have not used social-emotional resources available
  - Comments overwhelmingly positive
  - Some concerns that were voiced include amount of screen time, consistency of schedule/mask breaks, and the volume of school communications i.e. info needs to be bulleted and meaningful
  - 89.5% of our students have demonstrated growth, students that have not demonstrated growth have had modifications made to their plans

#### Chromebooks

- Reminder given to students today that Chromebooks cannot be used for non-school matters, and that the district has access to all student online activity
- Respectful and responsible online school behavior is expected, including after school hours

#### Attendance

- Guidelines are clear and State-mandated
- Seeing very significant uptick in absences in afternoon sessions (at times over 15% have been reported as half-day absences)
- Google collects this data automatically
- Letters will be sent to families with significant absences as a reminder/support
- Absences impact Franklin's overall ranking
- As a community, we need to be mindful and have conversations with our children about appropriate device usage and attendance
- Tierney welcomes creative ideas and solutions
- Parent asked about Wednesday afternoon professional development and if there is any possibility of having some staff present to monitor students during that time
  - Tierney notes that aides and paraprofessionals are engaging in professional development as well
  - Instead suggests informing students that teachers get reports of how their time is spent



- Tierney will think about how we can increase student accountability and celebrate their participation
- Parent inquired if more absences occur during specials or math rotation
  - Heavier during specials, students not feeling as accountable during the gradewide meets
  - Parent noticed that her 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> graders have a harder time when they are asked to move around, switch gears during afternoon session
- Parent questioned status of standardized testing this year
  - District awaiting state guidelines
  - Tierney noted that district does a tremendous amount of data collection and monitoring, standardized testing is only a piece of it
- Tierney reiterated that the level of support provided to faculty by our families and PTO has been beyond description and greatly appreciated
  - Lunch, treats, notes, outpouring of support have molded the positive climate at Franklin and continue to do so

## 4. Virtual Performing Arts Workshop Update (Laura Heil & Sue Huffman)

- Excited to keep performing arts alive at Franklin
- PTO partnership with Wharton School of Performing Arts
- 7-week workshop for 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders to conceptualize, write, rehearse, and perform an original theatre piece
- o Both class sections were filled within two hours of opening registration

## 5. Mini Grant Program (Casey Cohen)

- Mini grants enhance, extend, and enrich classroom curriculum
- o PTO has been able to fund three different teacher mini grants
  - 1st and 2nd graders received juggling scarves for tactical play and brain breaks
  - Speech therapists were able to purchase interactive videos to support students
  - 5<sup>th</sup> graders were supported with additional supplies to make their diorama units more robust
